### Hospital CNAs Receive Higher Pay than Nursing Home & Home Health CNAs

Oakland, NJ, November 28--The **2006-2007 Nursing Department Report** just published by **Hospital and Healthcare Compensation Service (HCS)** shows that Certified Nurse Aides (CNAs) employed by hospitals receive higher pay than home health agency and nursing home CNAs. The national hourly rate for home health CNAs was \$11.00 per hour compared to \$10.33 for nursing home CNAs, while hospital CNAs received \$11.49 per hour. The highest CNA turnover rate was reported for nursing homes. The CNA turnover rate reported for nursing homes was 42.75%, hospital CNA turnover was 24.97%, and home health CNA turnover was 24.87%.

The fifteenth annual **Nursing Department Report** includes data from 4,207 healthcare facilities. The complete 200-page **Report** contains salary and wage data on nurses and aides employed in hospitals, nursing homes and home health agencies.

Data are reported by state, nine regions, nationally, annual revenue sizes, profit status, and according to principal cities where sufficient data were available. Shown are base salaries, hourly or per visit rates, bonuses, and actual and planned percent increases.
